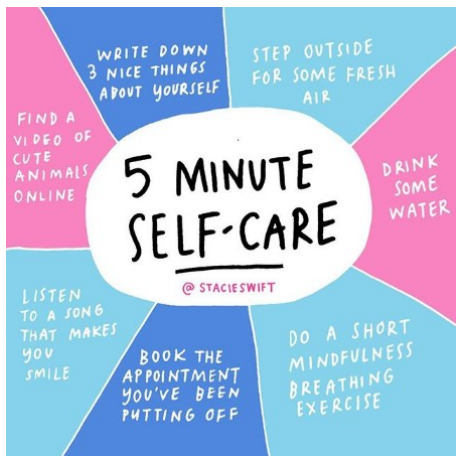


So it's a new year

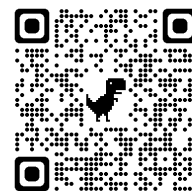
