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



4-H "Bummer of a Summer"



The 4-H project showcase brought together Wayne County youth to highlight and showcase their hard work despite the pandemic. The 4-H members showcased spent many hours learning new skills and applying them to their exhibits throughout the year. The exhibits were evaluated by a judge - a process that improves the youth's public speaking ability and also gains them valuable feedback that can be applied to their project area moving forward. Exhibits included animals (rabbit, cavy, poultry, horse, dairy, and goat) and static exhibits (communications and expressive arts, STEM, fine arts and crafts, textiles, home environment, visual arts and photography, and horticulture).



Strong Museum of Play Exibit

Static exhibits were displayed around Wayne County at partnering businesses and organizations (Strengthening our Area Residents in Clyde, The Ohmann Theater in Lyons, FLX Community Schools in Sodus, Williamson Public Library, The James Sullivan Agency in Marion, Books Etc in Macedon and the Newark-Arcadia Historical Society & Museum). One static exhibitor from each participant was also featured in a display at the Strong Museum of Play in Rochester! The showcase was well received and 30% of the total exhibitors from last year's Wayne County Fair participated.
